Yearbook listings can be difficult to interpret, especially for new Listers.

You might be asking yourself, "What does **CA CL C** mean?"

We have broken down this *Yearbook* listing to help you understand what it means.

CALICO WILLOWLEAF	CA CL C	Prolific plants that topped their 8 trellis and set big handfuls of pods all up and down. Leaves truly are like willow or bamboo leaves: each leaflet is very long and narrow, and slightly silvery. Looked wonderful covering their trellis. Seeds are bright pink with darker pink speckles, and on the smaller side ("butterbeans"). Good flavor. These have an amazing story of being narrowly saved from extinction twice thanks to OK MC G-- to read the full account search "gardenweb beans for oklahoma" on the internet and then search for "willowleaf" within that page.

1. VARIETY NAME

This is a variety of lima bean called 'Calico Willowleaf.'

2. LISTER CODE

The Lister Code is divided into two parts:

CA CL C

1. LISTER ORIGIN

State, Province, or Country of the Lister offering the seeds.

2. LISTER NAME

First two letters of last name and first letter of first name.

CA CL C = Cynthia Clark of California. Each individual offering seed is assigned a Lister Code. See the **Lister Profiles** section to find these codes and any pertinent information about the Listers, including specific ordering instructions and conditions. Send all orders and payment directly to the Listers offering the variety.

3. DESCRIPTION

This is the description provided by the Lister offering the seeds. Many descriptions include the source of the seed and year provided from other Listers. Seed companies may also be listed in abbreviated form here. See the appendices for seed company codes. Also in the appendices are more key terms and abbreviations used throughout the *Yearbook*.
